## Sensory Needs Service (SNS)

Wokingham Borough Council's Sensory Needs Service (SNS) are reaching out to residents who are visually impaired, d/Deaf, hard of hearing and Deafblind to ensure they are aware of the valuable support their service can offer them.

The SNS team, which includes staff able to communicate in British sign language, is available to assess the needs of residents and provide help and support which, for the visually impaired, may include mobility training and help with kitchen skills, movement and orientation, as well as providing them with information about services within the community.

## Lots about Litter and Waste!

### • **Community Litter Pick - 29 March**

The Finchampstead Community Litter Pick will take place on Sunday 29 March. If you would like to get involved please get in touch.

The largest groups will be meeting at the FBC Centre at 9.30am and at the Greyhound on Longwater Road at 10am. Just turn up on the day or contact us for more information.

If you would like to get together with a friend or a few neighbours to litter pick your road or local area do get in touch - we can provide the kit and some useful advice.

### • **Adopt a Street**

We are very grateful to our 30 'adopt a street' volunteers for the work they do to keep their local area clean and tidy. If you would like to get involved do get in touch - there is no commitment, volunteers do what they can when they can. We can provide a litter picker, hi vis vest and bags - which can be put out with your blue bags for collection.

### • **California Crossroads tidy up - 26 April**

We will be having another tidy up session at the crossroads on Sunday 26 April from 9.30am to 12 noon. Do come along and help with litter picking, weeding, sweeping and other tasks to help this important area look better.

### • **Blue bags are on their way**

Blue bags are now being distributed over with each household receiving 80 bags in two rolls of 40. Waste collections will continue on a weekly basis in the coming year.

You can purchase extra blue bags or brown garden waste bags at the Finchampstead Library. Food waste bags are also available - free of charge. Please call first to make sure they have bags in stock and to check opening hours. Telephone 0118 9088176.

### • **Garden Waste collections**

Garden waste opt in applications for 2020-21 are now open. The annual fee for a 240 litre brown wheeled bin is still £60. Visit [www.wokingham.gov.uk](http://www.wokingham.gov.uk) or call 0118 9746000 for details.

Making use of the service means residents are able to have 6,240 litres of green material including grass cuttings, prunings, leaves and weeds collected from the kerbside each year – more than one large skip.

The materials are then sent to Oxfordshire to a composting facility, creating **re3grow compost**, which is now available to residents from the Re3's household waste recycling centres at £3.50 per 40 litre bag.

This is an example of the council making the most of a circular economy, collecting something from residents and turning it into a useful resource.

## Consultation on the Wokingham Borough Council draft Local Plan

All homes should have received a 'Right Homes Rights Places' leaflet, seeking your views on the draft Local Plan which will be the blueprint for development in Wokingham Borough in the years ahead to 2036.

## Local development

- A Public Inquiry starts on 10 March into the appeal by Gladman Developments Ltd. against the refusal of permission for its proposed development at Woodcray, off the Finchampstead Road. Members of the public can attend the Inquiry - contact Wokingham Borough Council on 0118 9746000 for more information.

This proposed development site lies within Wokingham Town but as Finchampstead is an adjoining Parish we were consulted on - and submitted objections to - the proposals.

## Arborfield Garrison Strategic Development Location (SDL)

We have already submitted our comments on proposals for the management of the new **Arborfield Green Primary School** due to be opened in September 2021. The public consultation is now open - visit [www.wokingham.gov.uk](http://www.wokingham.gov.uk) and search for 'consultations' - comments need to be submitted by 13 March 2020.

The current proposal is for Farley Hill School to be moved to the new school - a proposal we support in principle but we do have concerns that a new school may take pupils from the Finchampstead schools and want to be sure that measures are put in place to ensure that there is no adverse impact on our local schools.

We are concerned that the **cycle / pedestrian route to Bohunt School** is missing a vital link - the final section of the route leading to the School - which means that school pupils are having to cycle across the Hazebrook Meadows open space. The open space is not meant to be cycled on, and the paths are only suitable for walkers. We are looking in to how the final link can be put in place as soon as possible.

### In February we have

- had a few more meetings! Planning Committee, Roads & Road Safety Committee and Main Council plus the Communications and Consultation Working Group and the first meeting of our Climate Change Working Group

- attended the Public Inquiry relating to proposals for up to 118 dwellings on land north of Nine Mile Ride adjacent to the California Country Park and presented our objections to the proposals
- attended the Wokingham Borough / Parish Liaison Forum (our Councillor Roland Cundy is now the Vice Chair of the Forum)
- met to discuss our response to the WBC Local Plan consultation
- run 4 Speedwatch sessions - with the help of residents and volunteers from the Finchampstead Neighbourhood Action Group (Finch NAG)
- considered and commented on the Finchampstead Sports Club proposals for improvements to the changing rooms, bar and groundsman facilities
- completed improvements to the path leading from Briarwood to the FBC Centre playing fields
- seen Nine Mile Ride Primary School, Finchampstead CE Primary School and Waverley School all show commitment to the eco schools programme [www.eco-schools.org.uk](http://www.eco-schools.org.uk) following our encouragement and the welcome assistance from a local volunteer with eco schools experience
- replaced the old noticeboard at the Memorial Hall with a recycled plastic board

- we have a few more meetings! Planning Committee - 5 March; Finance and General Management Committee - 10 March, Main Council - 18 March and Rights of Way Committee on 25 March.
