FAIR GREEN AND THE SITE OF THE FORMER VILLAGE MAYPOLE  $\rightarrow$ 

ON NOVEMBER  $6^{TH}$  1501 KING HENRY VII WAS HUNTING IN THESE WOODS WITH PRINCE ARTHUR AND PRINCE HENRY WHEN THE SPANISH ENVOYS CAME TO TELL HIM THAT PRINCE ARTHURS BRIDE, THE INFANTA KATHERINE OF ARAGON AND HER RETINUE HAD REACHED HIS LODGE AT DOGMERSFIELD.

THIS SIGNPOST IS MADE FROM PIECES OF YEW FROM THE OLD TREE THAT FORMERLY STOOD BESIDE THE  $16^{TH}$  C ALMSHOUSE WHICH TERMINATED THIS GREEN. THE TREE WAS CUT DOWN ON  $1^{ST}$  APRIL 1976.

THIS PLAQUE AND SIGNPOST WAS PLACED UPON THE GREEN BY THE FINCHAMPSTEAD SOCIETY, THE FINCHAMPSTEAD SCOUT GROUP AND THE BERKSHIRE BOY CHORISTORS ON THE 21<sup>ST</sup> OCTOBER 1978.
