



# Rights of Way Committee

Aims to ensure that the local network of footpaths and bridleways is kept in good condition, well signed and as accessible as possible.



#### Wet weather, wear and tear!









A Public Footpath means that you have the right to go along the path on foot. You don't have the right to cycle or ride a horse on it unless the landowner has given you their permission. If you do so without permission then you are trespassing.

#### THIS SPECIFIC PATH IS ONLY SUITABLE FOR PEDESTRIAN USE AND THE LANDOWNERS DO NOT GIVE THEIR PERMISSION FOR ANY OTHER USAGE.

#### Why is this rule important?

- Footpaths are designed for people travelling on foot and may contain hazards which you cannot see and which can be dangerous
- Use by cyclists or horse riders can easily damage the surface and the path
- Other users will not be looking out for you, which can put them and you at risk
  The path may go through working farmyards or near to animals which might

Finchampstead Parish Council is working with local landowners and Wokingham Borough Council to expand the options available for horse riders and cyclists.

Please respect other users and the law, and do not cycle or ride on this path.

### Community Infrastructure Levy










- £688,259 at the end of 2021/22
- Projects funded this year
  - Defibrillators for schools
  - Kissing gates and path improvements- War Memorial relocation

  - Community speedwatch signs and equipment - Allotment improvements

  - Tree planting
- Other projects underway and more being planned for 2022/23

# War Memorial relocation project – CIL funded



- 11 accidents over 20 years
- Involving 18 vehicles and 14 injuries
- 11,500 vehicles a day passing
- Dangerous for pedestrians
- Allows WBC to rethink the junction
- Preservation of the Memorial
- The Memorial Park is dedicated for remembrance





### FNDP - Progress Report 31/5/22

- Impact of loss of Grazeley Green on WBC's Local Plan and in turn the FNDP
- Assessment of sites work by FF and further public consultation
- WBC repeated LPU consultation Dec 21 /Jan 22
- Revised FNDP produced
- Technical assessment re environmental impact underway
- Next step is to submit FNDP to WBC to begin next phase of assessment and consultation prior to external examination, local referendum and adoption by WBC



## Key policies of the FNDP

- ► GS1 Key Local Gaps, Green Wedges and Important Areas of Separation to prevent coalescence of settlements
- ▶ D2 Preserving the rural character of the parish
- ► IRS1- Protection and enhancement of Local Green Spaces (13 identified)
- ► IRS2 Protection of outstanding views (4 identified)
- ► IRS3 Protection and enhancement of the historic character of the area

## Key benefits of having an NDP

- Additional policies to ensure that development does not detrimentally affect what we value and wish to protect most
- ► Local people having a say in where, and where not, additional housing should be placed to meet need
- Once 'adopted', additional protection against speculative development if WBC cannot show a fiveyear housing land supply (for two-years provided WBC can show 3YHLS)
- ► Local people influencing what new developments should look like and what infrastructure should be provided
