- First aid / defibrillator training session held in October 2022 – another session being planned for April 2023






Gorse Ride regeneration

- Phase 1 completed 2021 46 homes on Arnett Avenue
- Phase 2 work commenced on Phase 2A autumn 2022.
 Completion of Phase 2 249 homes in total expected 2027
- High level of affordable / social housing
- Flagship development sustainability



Arborfield Green and Finchwood Park





- Homes occupied to date at Arborfield Green include around 350 in Finchampstead
- Finchwood Park eventually 1500 homes plus community facilities including a school and allotments
- Around 100 homes occupied so far

 Liaising with WBC over completion, public access and legal designation of Rights of Way





- £1,344,641 at the end of 2022/23
- Projects funded this year
 - Path and bridlepath improvements
 - War Memorial relocation
 - Wellingtonia Avenue tree surveys
 - Cycleway feasibility study
 - o Tree planting

CIL – plans for 2023/24

Expecting to invest significant CIL funds in 2023/24

- Co-funding new playground equipment for the Village School
- Supporting major WBC projects
 - California Cross redevelopment
 - California Country Park improvements
 - Contributing to improving the 'war memorial junction'



- Extraordinary economic times - inflation
- Some positive factors for FPC in 2023/24
 - Interest rates have risen
 - Tax base has increased
- 2023/24 precept £192,154
- £29.32 for the year 2023/24 for a Band D household

FNDP - Progress Report 8 March 2023

- Draft Plan submitted to WBC in August 2022
- Regulation 16 consultation, organised by WBC, October to November 2022
- Independent Examiner appointed by WBC December 2022
- Examination underway
- Next (and final) stage a Referendum
