- Electorate: 10,037 Ballot Papers Issued: 2604 Turnout: 25.95%

# Gorse Ride regeneration

- Phase 1 completed 2021 46 homes on Arnett Avenue
- Phase 2A residents will start to move into their new homes in the Spring.







# Arborfield Green and Finchwood Park

Works to start soon with a new heart for the community District Centre.

- Sainsbury's has been given the go ahead at the Nine Mile Ride extension as part of a larger district centre.
- Pedestrianised high street

- 18 retail units

- 206 new houses & flats

- Extraction operations complete and resoration is underway



### Traffic Monitoring





- Roadside Speedwatch sessions – almost 1343 vehicles reported May 2022 to date
- Average 20 vehicles per session
- Working in line with new Thames Valley Police guidance and requirements



  - o Play equipment at Waverley Way park
  - Allotment water troughs and new gates
  - o Solar Panels at the Ratepayers Hall
  - Refurbishment of the kitchen and disabled toilet at St James' Church centre.
